

- When and how do I log on with the Coast Guard?
- Do I have to submit a passage race crew list?
- What race radio channel should I be using

(hint SI's #17.5) (hint SI's #17.2)

- (hint Sl's #14)
- Why will I be ridiculed at length for sending my crew up to the bow to get my finish time. (hint Si's #12.2)
  - What do I do with my finish time? (hint SI's #Si's 12.4)
  - Do we start at Glenelg?

- (hint SI's #11.3)
- Is it a good idea to read through the SI's and Skippers Handbook? (hint yes 🐵, there may be prizes)
